

OZEV Grant Changes in 2022

APPROVED

The Office for Zero Emission Vehicles are implementing changes to the Electric Vehicle Home charge Scheme (EVHS) and the Electric Vehicle Workplace Charging Scheme (WCS). The new changes will be implemented on 1st April 2022.

Electric Vehicle Homecharge Scheme (EVHS) New Criteria:

Building owners (includes landlords and social housing providers)

- A £350 grant is available per EV charging unit (Maximum grant of up to £70,000 and limited to 200 applications)
- Claimants must be a registered business or public authority and the property must have allocated private parking

Owners of apartment blocks

- Up to £30,000 is available from OZEV per building (Limited to 30 applications)
- The grant value is calculated on how many parking bays are available to have an EV charger installed (A grant of up to £850 is available per bay)
- To prepare infrastructure for future EV installations a grant of up to £500 per bay is available
- Claimants must be a registered business or public authority and the property must have allocated private parking
- The maximum grant is £30,000 per property (there is no limit on the number of chargers)
- At least 5 bays must be allocated for EV charging (with at least 1 working charger installed)

Electric Vehicle Workplace Charging Scheme (WCS) New Criteria:

Workplaces

- A £350 grant is available per EV charging unit (Maximum grant of up to £14,000)
- Claimants must be registered with Companies House or VAT registered
- Private parking must be available for staff/fleet use only

Small accommodation or charities

- A £350 grant is available per EV charging unit (Maximum grant of up to £14,000 and limited to 40 applications)
- Must be either a registered charity or employ less than 250 people
- Off-street parking must be available

Owners of commercially let properties

- A £350 grant is available per EV charging unit (Maximum grant of up to £35,000 and limited to 100 applications)
- Claimants must be a registered business or public authority and the let property must have allocated parking where the charge point is installed and reserved for staff/fleet use

SMEs (Small & medium-sized enterprises)

- Up to £850 is available per parking bay (Maximum grant of up to £15,000 and limited to 5 applications)
- To prepare infrastructure for future EV installations a grant of up to £500 per bay is available and charge points must be installed with private parking
- Claimants must be a registered with Companies House or VAT registered and employ less than 250 people
- At least 5 bays must be allocated for EV charging (with at least 1 working charger installed)
